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Turnitin Compares College and Secondary Education Students' Sources of Potential Plagiarism and Unoriginal Content

Secondary education students rely less on cheat sites and paper mills and more on social networks compared to college students

OAKLAND, Calif. – November 3, 2011 – iParadigms, creators of Turnitin and the leader in originality checking and online grading, today announced the results of a new plagiarism study which shows that secondary school students in the United States rely more heavily on social networks for content in their papers and less on cheat sites and paper mills compared to college students.

“We hope that sharing this data will help educators initiate discussions with students regarding plagiarism and student writing,” said Chris Harrick, vice president of marketing at Turnitin. “Solutions like Turnitin can reduce unoriginal content by 50 to 75 percent for secondary and higher education schools while teaching students how to research, cite, and write correctly.”

The Turnitin study follows a recent report by the Pew Research Center that shows growing concern among college presidents about the issue of plagiarism. Of the 1,055 presidents surveyed, 55 percent believe that plagiarism is increasing in their institutions while just two percent believe it is decreasing.

The new Turnitin study examined 128 million content matches from 33 million student papers that were submitted to Turnitin between June 2010 and June 2011. The study uncovered the most popular categories of content used in student papers.
